PROVINCE DE QUÉBEC
MUNICIPALITÉ DE LA PÊCHE**

BY-LAW 13-649

**PERTAINING TO TRAFFIC OF TRUCK, EQUIPMENT TRANSPORT
VEHICLES AND SERVICE VEHICLES ON MUNICIPAL ROADS.**

Whereas paragraph 5 of article 626 of the Highway Safety Code (RSQ, c. C-24.2) allows the municipality to adopt a by-law prohibiting traffic on indicated roads if this prohibition is indicated by an appropriate signs;

Whereas the article 291 of the Highway Safety Code (RSQ, c. C-24.2) allow the municipality to restrain or prohibit on a road, for which is responsible of the maintenance, the traffic of all or some heavy vehicles.

Whereas the article 291 of the Highway Safety Code (RSQ, c. C-24.2) foresee the restriction or prohibition of traffic in the article 291 can be partly lifted, by an appropriate sign, to allow to go to a place which is accessible only through the prohibited zone, in order to take or to deliver a good, to provide a service or carry out work, to repair the vehicle or to bring the vehicle to its home point;

Whereas it is necessary to regulate truck, transport and service vehicle traffic on public roads that the Municipality is responsible to maintaining, in order to ensure the preservation of the road network, the safety of residents and tranquility of residential sectors;

Whereas a notice of motion of this by-law was given during the council meeting of February 4th, 2013;

Therefore, the municipal council decrees and ordains as follows:

ARTICLE 1

The present by-law is entitled By-law pertaining to traffic of trucks, equipment transport vehicles and service vehicles and the preamble is an integral part of the by-law.

ARTICLE 2

In this by-law the definition is as follows:

Truck: a road vehicle, other than an emergency vehicle, which the weight is more than 4 500 kg or more and designed and constructed primarily for the transport of goods or transport of equipment that is permanently attached and its accessories. Are also trucks, a combination of road vehicles, which at least one of the vehicles has a gross weight of 4500 kg or more;

Service vehicle: a road vehicle, other than a vehicle build on a truck chassis, designed to carry out some work and which the work station is inside the driver's compartment of the vehicle. For the purpose of this definition, a truck chassis is a frame equipped with mechanisms required on a road vehicle designed to transport people, goods or equipment;

Road vehicle: A motorized vehicle which can be operated on a road, except for vehicles that operate exclusively on rail and electric wheelchairs; trailers, semi-trailers and vehicles with an attachable-detachable auxiliary axle are considered road vehicles;

Local delivery: Deliveries in a prohibited traffic zone which is indicated by signs, authorizing trucks, transport vehicles and service vehicles drivers to use the prohibited traffic zone for any of the following purposes on this road:

- ✓ pick up or deliver goods
- ✓ provide a service
- ✓ carry out work
- ✓ vehicle repairs
- ✓ to bring the vehicle to its home point

Home point: The vehicle's home point refers to the company's business location, which means where the vehicle is stowed, the company's office, warehouse, garage or parking area.

Emergency vehicle: a truck used as police, in conformity with the Police Act (RSQ, c. P-13.1) a vehicle use as ambulance in conformity with the Act respecting pre-hospital emergency services (RSQ, c. S-6) a vehicle use for the firefighting equipment of any other vehicle which satisfies the criteria establish by Law to be recognize as emergency vehicle by the Société de l'assurance automobile du Québec (SAAQ).

ARTICLE 3

The traffic of truck, transport vehicles and service vehicles is prohibited on the roads enumerate in the Appendix I, attach to the by-law to for an integral part as if it was here reproduce.

The public road enumerate as Appendix I are showed on the road map prepared by the public work department and is attach to the by-law as Appendix II to for an integral part as if it was here reproduce.

ARTICLE 4

Article 3 does not apply to trucks and service vehicles which must get to an area which is accessible only through the prohibited zone, to carry out one or the other of the tasks listed under local delivery.

It does not apply:

- a) To non standard vehicles operating with a special permit authorizing express access to the prohibited road;
- b) To agricultural machinery, farm tractors and other farm vehicles, as defined in the Road vehicle registration regulation (order-in-council 1420-91 dated October 16th 1991).
- c) To tow trucks ;
- d) To emergency vehicles

The exception anticipated to the present by-law are indicated by sign of type P-130-P or P-130-20 authorising the local delivery

ARTICLE 5

Unless otherwise stated on the plan in Appendix II, each prohibited road or part of road is considered a prohibit traffic zone.

However, if they are adjacent they are considered the same prohibited zone.

When roads and a prohibited road, maintained by the Ministry of Transport or another municipality, are adjacent, they are part of a common prohibited traffic zone including all adjacent prohibited roads.

The prohibited traffic zone is indicated by signs installed in accordance with the attached plan, at the extremities of the prohibited roads and at the intersection of roads where traffic is allowed. These signs must be of P-130-1 type, to which is attached a smaller sign of type P-130-P or P-130-20.

Anywhere else than at the end of the prohibited traffic zone, the prohibited roads can be indicated by information signs of type P-130-24, which refer to the restriction P-130-P or P-130-20, particularly at the municipal boundaries.

ARTICLE 6

Anyone who violates article 3 commits an offence and is liable to the same fine as provided in the Highway Safety Code (RSQ, c. C-24.2).²

ARTICLE 7

This by-law abrogates and replaces the by-laws 04-452 and 08-520, and will come into force following the approval of the Minister of Transport, in accordance with article 627 of the Highway Safety Code.

² In accordance with article 627 of the Highway Safety Code the fines must be equal to those imposed by the Code for similar offences. In accordance with article 315.2 of the Code, the fine prescribed id from \$175 to \$525.
