Giant Hogweed

It is important to properly identify Giant Hogweed so as not to mistake it for cow-parsnip (or common cow-parsnip) which looks very similar. Giant hogweed causes painful blisters and severe burns if you get the sap on your skin. The plant grows from 2 to 5 metres tall and it has white flowers clustered in an umbrella-shaped head measuring 25 to 50 cm wide. It has a thick hollow stem and large lobed leaves. The stem, which is 4 to 10 cm wide, is covered with stiff white hairs filled with sap and scattered along the whole of the stem, but especially found at the base of the leaf stalks. The underside of the compound leaves is smooth or slightly scaly and they are divided into 2 or 3 deeply incised segments.

To control the spread of Giant hogweed, you must remove as much of the root as possible just before it produces seeds. Using a spade, cut off the roots at a depth of about 20 cm, ideally in early spring and repeat the process several times throughout the year. When handling this plant, you must totally cover up with protective clothing and eye wear and protect your face as well.
